A Message from the Principal

Dear Coyote Families,

As the summer break ends I would like to share that the "Project READy" program for incoming kindergarten students had 25 families with consistent participation, lesson packets were picked up every Wednesday and Story time was held at 12:00p.m. Our Summer Skills provided various events such as art, board games, lego's, music/dance, cooking, recreation, math games, and technology (computer lab) with an average of 65 students attending Monday through Thursday.

Class orientations will be held the last week of July, orientations will be held in the classrooms except for 6th grade (Orientation will be held in the MPR). Dates and times are listed below:

Students return to school on August 3rd.

Doors open at 7:25a.m., if students are going to have breakfast, they can go directly into the MPR. If not, they are to go outside. The morning bell rings at 7:56a.m. If a student arrives after this time, it is considered a tardy.

SAFETY CHANGES:

- Only students will be allowed in the building in the mornings.
- Parents of kindergarteners may walk their students to class the first two days **"ONLY"**. Moving forward, adults, parents, siblings will not be allowed to hang out in the mornings. ALL adults visiting the school must sign in at the front office and get a visitors badge.

Welcome back Coyotes, and let's make it a great year!


